Pete was a longtime member of the North Tongass Community Club, Moose Club, and Pioneers of Alaska. His trades in life were many, but his biggest was Tow Boating. After many years of working on different Tugs and with great Captains, such as Clyde Cowan on the Amak, and Andy Thompson on the Sharon H. Pete skippered the Mary Catherine H for many years. Also the E.W. Borgen & the Skookum Logger during the Mill years.

After Pete learned to be the best he could be on the water, he wanted to be his own Captain, so he and Diana began their new adventure of running their business known as A.K. Tug and Barge. Their Tug was the Norton Bay. His life on the waters of Southeast Alaska was a huge part, always serving his customers with a smile and a few jokes. He once wrote "the most fun he had was to deliver Christmas trees to the logging camps all over Southeast Alaska." He retired at the age of 65.

In 2010, Pete and Diana moved to Puyallup, Washington. He was preceded in death by his son, Eric Amundson.
